CABARET CONNEXION FESTIVAL PERFORMERS, TEACHERS AND PANELISTS

SUSAN ARJMAND (Chicago) is a family medicine physician with academic appointments at Rush Medical College and the University of Illinois College of Medicine. She has published and lectured nationally and internationally on the topic of primary care and vocal health for singers. As a professional classical singer, she has performed with Light Opera Works, Bowen Park Opera Company, the Gilbert and Sullivan Opera Company, L'Opera Piccola, Chamber Opera Chicago, and several choral groups. She organizes the monthly salon series Opera Inter Alia.

MICHÈLE BARBIER (Paris) began as an actress, left everything for the circus, then was discovered by the legendary Josephine Baker to become her private assistant. 
